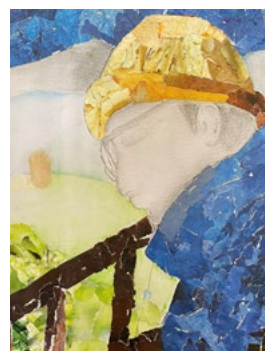

YOUNG ARCHIES AWARDS



Based on the famous Archibald Prize, the Young Archies Awards is a portrait competition open to all students in Department of Education schools and colleges.

Awards are presented in year categories for the best portrait of a person created by a student during the 12 months before the closing date. Portraits can be in any 2D media, such as a drawing, painting or collage, but cannot include photography. The portrait must be of someone personally known to the student.

DETAILS OF AWARDS

All entries will receive a Certificate of Participation and prizes will be awarded for:

- Category winners (\$100)
- Overall Primary Winner (Kindergarten to Year 6 - \$150)
- Overall Secondary Winner (Year 7 to Year 12 - \$150)
- People's Choice Award (\$100)
- Packing Room Prize (\$100)
- Department of Education – Secretary's Award (\$100)
- Commissioner for Children and Young People's Award (\$100)

Schools will be notified of award winners on: **24 August 2022.**

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Each student may enter only one portrait to their school/ college.
- **A maximum of 4 portraits per category** can be forwarded from each primary or high school. Colleges may submit up to 8 entries.
- The artwork must be two dimensional, such as drawings, paintings, and collage, and cannot include photography.
- The portrait may be created on any shaped paper, canvas or wood (two dimensional).
- The portrait must be **no larger in size than 10,000 square cm** e.g. 1m x 1m. These measurements apply to the actual work of art and not mounting.
- If mounted please keep the size in proportion with the artwork.
- Canvases and framed artwork need to have a string or wire firmly attached to the back of the artwork for hanging. Heavy frames and glass are not permitted.
- Portraits submitted for the Young Archies Awards must be of someone **personally known to the student**. The portrait subject can be reproduced from life, from a photograph or from memory, and can be a self-portrait.
- The student's teacher and parent/guardian must sign the signature label to confirm that the portrait is completely the student's own work.
- The student's parent/guardian and the student must sign the signature label to give permission for the display of the work.
- **Entries must be received by the Project Officer no later than Friday 5 August 2022.** Unfortunately we will be unable to accept late entries.
- Artwork will be returned to schools at the close of the exhibition period with no cost to schools.

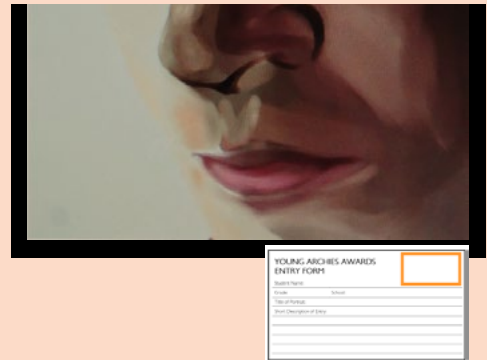
JUDGING CRITERIA

Each artwork must:

- Be an original work
- Depict a person personally known to the student
- Capture the essence of the subject

ENTRY FORM AND LABEL

- **All entries must** have the entry form attached to the bottom-right corner on the front of the work.
- The entry form should **not cover** any of the artwork (example below).



- **All entries must** have the signature label attached to the back of the work.
- Please print clearly or type on both documents.
