Service Engagement Record (SER) – new ECU document

The ECU has developed a new template to reflect both compliance and quality aspects of a service when our Authorised Officers (AO) conduct monitoring visits.

Formerly known as a 'Visit Summary Sheet', the SER lists 'key takeaways' for services to consider after a visit is conducted by an AO. Its purpose is to enhance transparency and ensure services, approved providers and AOs have a shared understanding on key areas after each visit.

Resource Finder tool – ACECQA

Earlier this year, the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) launched a resource finder tool to help users to easily search and find resources, such as reports, videos and information sheets on a wide variety of topics.

This tool allows users to access over 240 online resources and will be updated with new content from ACECQA. Type any key words into the search bar and if required, use the check boxes to refine your results by topic, category, or resource type.

A helpful tip is to use the 'Export your search' function to download a go-to spreadsheet containing titles and URLs for all the resources generated on a search.

2019 NQF Review – Decision Regulation Impact Statement (DRIS)

The 2019 NQF Review aims to ensure the NQF remains current and continues to improve practice in the education and care sector. The DRIS was published on 8 June 2022 and can be accessed through the [2019 NQF Review website](#).

The DRIS summarises the issues, options considered by governments, recommended changes to practice and recommended changes to the National Law and Regulations following public consultation.

Free flu-vaccination

The ECU is sharing this information on behalf of Public Health.

Free flu-vaccination clinics are available for children from 6 months. Parents may visit their local GPs and state-run community clinics for a free flu-vaccination. State-run vaccination clinics also provide COVID-19 vaccinations and boosters to anyone aged 5 years and older.
