Nominated Supervisor responsibilities

Since I July 2023 the ECU has been consistently reviewing and considering the legislated responsibilities of Nominated Supervisors as part of monitoring and investigation into compliance with the *Education and Care Services National Law* (National Law) and the *Education and Care Services National Regulations* (National Regulations).

This has provided opportunities to discuss responsibilities and requirements with a range of individuals across services.

Where required, the ECU has promoted opportunities for reflection and improvement of mentoring and oversight systems to assist in lifting quality and compliance to improve quality experiences and outcomes for children.

Our regulatory approach in the first instance has been educative and centred on capacity building, and only where a significant incident occurs, or there is a trend of unwilling and unable to comply with legislated requirements does the ECU move to further enforcement tools.

To this end, we have been pleased by the take-up of the Leading in Early Education and Care Program 2023-24 (LEEC).

Funded by the ECU Grants Program, LEEC aims to build upon the capabilities and capacity of both Nominated Supervisors and emerging leaders working in ECEC services in Tasmania. 74 participants from across the State have now completed their virtual onboarding sessions. The first face-to-face workshops will commence in Hobart, Launceston and Devonport

in November. We look forward to bringing you further updates as the program progresses.

Policies and procedures for safe arrival of children between services and schools – I October 2023 changes

Children travelling between an education and care service and any other education or early childhood service requires careful planning to maintain children's health, safety and wellbeing.

From I October 2023 several changes to the National Regulations enhancing policies, procedures and risk assessments required for the safe arrival of children travelling between services, or between schools and services came into effect.

The new legislative requirements require an approved provider to:

 Ensure the service has policies and procedures in place for the safe arrival of children who travel between an education and care service and any other education or early childhood service.

 Conduct a risk assessment at least once every 12 months, and as soon as practicable after becoming aware of any circumstance that may affect the safe arrival of children travelling between an education and care service and any other education or early childhood service.

Family Day Care Register – new requirement in effect from 1 October 2023

There are a number of new requirements in place for family day care (FDC) from I October 2023 which are designed to improve regulatory oversight and safety.

These include a new requirement for approved providers to ensure that the details of when FDC educators are approved to educate and care for more than seven children, or more than four children who are preschool age or under, at any one time, due to exceptional circumstances, are kept on the register of FDC educators.

The details must include the:

- nature of an exceptional circumstance / nature of exceptional circumstances
- date of when approval was granted by the approved provider
- name of person who granted the approval
- the date of birth and name of each child educated and cared for as part of the approval

• the period which the FDC educator is approved to educate and care for more than seven children, or for more than four children who are preschool age or under.

Other changes to the NQF for all services

There are a number of changes to the NQF that commenced in 2023 that apply to all education and care services, including FDC.

As a reminder, the changes stem from the 2019 NQF Review (the Review). The implementation of regulatory changes resulting from the Review is occurring in phases, with initial rounds of changes coming into effect on 1 March 2023 and 1 July 2023. The third round of regulatory changes came into effect on 1 October 2023. A further round of regulatory changes is expected to take effect in early 2024.

ACECQA has updated its <u>Policy and Procedure</u> <u>Guidelines</u>⁷ as well as the <u>Guide to the National Quality</u> <u>Framework</u>⁸ to provide guidance on all new requirements.

Burn safety and sun protection – seasonal reminder

Under both the National Law and the *Child Care Act 2001*, providers and services must ensure that policies and procedures are in place in relation to sun protection and must take reasonable steps to ensure those policies and procedures are followed.

Good quality shade can reduce overall exposure to the suns UV. When combined with appropriate clothing, hats and sunscreen, children can be well protected from UV outdoors.

Each service is different, and services need to contextualise policies and procedures to suit their situation. Things to consider include:



- Shade can be natural (eg: from a tree with a dense canopy), built (eg: a veranda) or temporary (eg: umbrellas or shade cloths).
- Playground equipment and surfacing can heat up rapidly and retain heat. This can cause serious burns and scalds to skin upon contact.
 For example, metals, dark colour fall absorption materials and synthetic grass have been known to cause burns.
- Rough, uneven surfaces (like grass or pine bark) reflect less UV than smooth, shiny, lightcoloured surfaces (such as concrete, glass or water).
- Excursions can present different sun exposure risks, so it is important that sun protection is considered as part of excursion risk assessments.

Minor Infrastructure Grants – 2023-24 round now open

The ECU invites eligible education and care services and licensed child care services to apply for one-off grant funding to complete upgrades to an education and care or child care service premises.

This round of grant funding will close on Sunday 10 December 2023.

Pending Outside School Hour Care 2024 service approvals

The ECU recommends all applications for service approvals for new Outside School Hour Care (OSHC) services wishing to commence operations at the start of 2024 be submitted through NQA ITS as soon as possible.

Historically, the ECU has received a large number of applications at the end of the year with services intending to commence operations the following year. Submitting your application by the end of November 2023 will allow the ECU adequate time to consider the application prior to proposed commencement.

OSHC services intending to use a location belonging to the Department for Education, Children and Young People are required to undergo a tender process. The Strong Partnerships Co-location Policy¹⁷ estimate a four month period for this process to be conducted. Refer to the Strong Partnerships¹⁸ web page for more information.
