Learning Area Statement:

Courses in the Humanities and Social Sciences Learning Area provide a broad understanding of the world in which we live, and how people can participate in the world as active and informed citizens with high-level skills needed for the 21st century.

Through studying the humanities and social sciences, learners develop the ability to question, think critically, solve problems, communicate effectively, make decisions and adapt to change. Thinking about and responding to issues is a significant part of many courses in the learning area, and this requires an understanding of the key historical, geographical, political, economic and societal factors involved, and familiarity with how these different factors interrelate.

Australian School-based Apprenticeships

An Australian School-based Apprenticeship (ASbA) is a paid, employment-based training arrangement.

Students in Year 10, 11 or 12 are able to combine work, training and education to gain a nationally recognised qualification, usually at Certificate II or III level – across almost every industry sector and training package.

What could an ASbA look like in the HASS learning area?

This learning area complements ASbA pathways. For example, a learner could be employed as a school-based trainee one or two days a week in the State Service.
