Learning Area Statement:

The study of Languages provides access to the cultures of other countries and communities. It promotes understanding of different attitudes and values within the wider Australian community and the global community. It focusses on developing the ability to understand and use a language acknowledging that plurilingualism and multiculturalism have an integral place in Australian society.

Communicating through language is a complex and rich human activity. Learning a language contributes meaningful dimensions to each student's overall education and their understanding of the world. In conjunction with other skills, knowledge of an additional Language enhances each student's repertoire of skills for the 21st century and expands opportunities in all areas of human endeavour. Students develop an awareness of world views and extend their understanding of their own heritage, values, culture and identity. Knowledge of more than one language enhances literacy skills, assists students to become effective communicators in a complex global environment and extends their ability to moderate and reflect on their experiences.

Australian School-based Apprenticeships

An Australian School-based Apprenticeship (ASbA) is a paid, employment-based training arrangement.

Students in Year 10, 11 or 12 are able to combine work, training and education to gain a nationally recognised qualification, usually at Certificate II or III level – across almost every industry sector and training package.

What could an ASbA look like in the Langauges learning area?

This learning area complements ASbA pathways. For example, a learner could be employed as a school-based apprentice one or two days a week in the tourism and hospitality industry.
