	Chris Laycock volunteered to take notes. David Morris chaired the Northern component of the meeting. Jill Abell in Hobart chaired the joint Skype meeting.
	THIS REPORT AUGMENTS AND DOES NOT REPLACE THE SOUTHERN MODERATION MEETING'S REPORT. As the bulk of the meeting was a joint meeting, North and South meeting by Skype, these notes below add to the common report from the Skype meeting provided by the Southern Moderation Meeting.
	1. Current approaches to teaching academic integrity and broader information literacy, researching and referencing were shared.
	2. The use of Canvas LMS 2018 and outreach to libraries in secondary and Big Picture schools offering Year 11/12 courses, particularly those without professional teacher librarians or generalist teachers managing the school library



were discussed. One private school used the Department		
of NSW's "HSC All My Own Work Program"		
(https://educationstandards.nsw.edu.au/wps/portal/nesa/11-		
12/hsc/hsc-all-my-own-work) to instruct students in areas		
of academic integrity. This private school entirely delivers		
this using the online modules.		

3. Sample tools and guides for specific referencing systems mandated by TASC (APA6e and MLA8) and Harvard conventions were discussed.

4. ACRL's Threshold concepts in their Framework for Information Literacy was discussed, including recentlydeveloped assessment tools such as the Threshold Achievement Test for Information Literacy (TATIL) (https://thresholdachievement.com). TATIL's approach could be used to provide teacher librarians and class teachers with evidence to better understand the information literacy capabilities of their students. Such datadriven insights could inform teacher librarians and teachers of weak areas, guide course instruction, affirm growth following instruction, and prepare students to be successful in learning and life.

5. Other agenda items as per the Southern Moderation Meeting's report (as this was done jointly between North and South meetings using Skype).

6. Proposal/All agreed: Request that TASC - Library Networking be supported as a Statewide (Skype) meeting to support everyone on N and NW coast as well as South. For implementing at the March 2019 Moderation meeting.
