revealed some worrying imbalances and a lack of clarity regarding criteria, content, as well as the comparability of standards, especially in regards to criterion 5, which is assessed externally on both units 4.1 and 4.2

The assessment of this criterion externally is a significant matter of concern, both for this year and into the future. Addressing contemporary issues (criterion 5) naturally arises within the Ethics unit, whereas, at least in its current form, it appears to be an inauthentic afterthought for unit 4.2

The teachers present at the meeting, as well as those in the North who we conversed with via Skype, are willing to form working parties addressing identified issues of concern in order to facilitate the refinement of the course to a more satisfactory standard.

The Campbelltown meeting, which we called for following our March Moderation process, was an appropriate format in which to address our concerns and create some consensus regarding our delivery and assessment of the course for this year. If we were to be given a similar opportunity later this year, we believe we could make important amendments that would see the course in a much stronger position for future students and teachers alike.
