Crit 3: B+, Crit 4: B, Crit 8: C

Criterion 3: There is a discussion in the work presented about a range of ideas, but is it a wide range? Whilst there is a reflection at the end of the report, the student did not extensively tie it back to the design principles. Similarly, with the other elements - satisfactory amount of work gone into providing evidence, but just not that extra step. There is good consideration of other examples of what they are trying to achieve, but without extending themselves from existing use of robots.

Criterion 4: An A standard requires not only effective solutions, but elegant ones. A lot of work has gone into determining an effective solution, but without any evidence of refinement. No evidence of use of PPE (may not have been asked for), no evidence for tie line.

Criterion 8: General B standard - good use of terminology and conventions, but no referencing at all (t) and no use of use of planning strategies (t) which would need to be addressed to get more than a C.

Crit 3: need a wider range, and greater depth of prototypes, including explanation of engineering solutions that are unfamiliar, and greater reference back to criteria and constraints of brief.

Crit 4: Need to refine the solutions for elegance and document the iterations. Monitor and record progress towards meeting goals.

Crit 8: Basically, get referencing up to scratch, and ensure that tasks are completed within time frame set.

Really make sure that students are journaling each session to include all information. Model effective journaling and assess journals as part of the final assessment. Interim formative assessment to ensure students are on the right track. Explicitly state learning intentions and success criteria.
